2016 Trip to Shiloh Ranch

"The drive always sucks." That's what I was thinking as we started out on Wednesday evening for our Oklahoma pig hunt. The plan was to drive to Oklahoma City on Wednesday night, get up early and finish the drive to Shiloh Ranch in Stillwater Thursday morning so we would be fresh for an afternoon hunt.

After having breakfast and getting our groceries, with some creative navigating thrown in, we arrived at the ranch at 11:30. We went through the orientation, got our stuff, stowed, and were ready to hunt by 3:00. We all headed out to our spots to sit for the evening and see what was moving. As I was walking up to get into my blind I noticed there was a pig bedded against blind door. She was a big hog and I came to kill a meat hog so I pulled a 190gr tipped footed cedar arrow from my quiver, nocked it, and preceded to one lung her through the back. After that the goat rodeo was on! Any of you that know me know that mobility is not my strong point, and now I had a hog with an arrow in her squealing and running around at a place that I knew if she got away from me she would be counted as my hog. So now I run and chase her trying to get to stop so I could get another arrow in her. She would stop for a moment and I would send another arrow while out of breath trying to make a good shot. I ended up putting all five arrows in my quiver in her, the last being a text book heart shot, to make sure I had my hog secured. I probably did not need to put five arrows in her

but I remember reading Dr. Saxton Pope saying that if you can put another arrow into an animal, do it. So I had my hog an hour and a half into my hunt, do not pass up at the beginning of the hunt something you would shoot on the last day.



The next morning the guys went out for a morning hunt with Brian Shea hunting where I was the evening before and scoring on a large orange sow from the blind. James Kucera had a Russian boar come into his set that he got an arrow into. After looking for the hog with a young dog they were unable to find it. James and I went back to the same set that evening without seeing any hogs during our sit. As darkness started to fall I told James I was headed back to camp and he said he was going to look for his arrow since he shoots lighted nocks. Lo and behold James came across his hog! Made for a good night!



That's how we ended up; three hogs were brought back to Nebraska taken by traditional archers with classical equipment, a great hunt with great guys.
